The Nature of Bayshore

Prickles Don't Tickle

It has come to my attention that there are several members of our community who are dealing with a very prickly situation. No, it does not have to do with their neighbors or their neighbor's pets. Nor does it have to do with our HOA or the road district. It does have to do with a noxious weed called tackweed, (aka as puncturevine and goathead) or maybe burweed (aka spurrweed and sandspurrs) or a giant needleleaf or sandcarpet. I haven't been able to find an image online that looks like the ones I took. The plant identifier app on my phone said it is sandcarpet, but I can't find anything about it growing in Oregon. The truth is, I'm not 100% sure what it is but I do know it is very prickly, evasive, and difficult to eradicate.

There is no doubt that it is a low growing weed that spreads and has burrs. These burrs are painful to step on for both humans and dogs. Additionally, the burrs stick to the bottom of shoes and are easily tracked into the house, where they can adhere themselves to rugs and carpets. They can get stuck in your dog's fur and tracked into your house as well. All and all, this weed is something we want to get rid of as quickly as possible.

To help minimize its spread, please check your property for this weed. If you find it, please try to get rid of it. Some people suggest spraying it with a strong weedkiller. Then, once it has died, digging it up. You also can spray it with a post-emergent herbicide with 2,4-D in it between December and February to kill the weed before it sets more seeds for the next Spring. Whatever method you choose, please be sure to wear thick soled shoes and good gloves! Here are some pictures I took to help you identify if this weed is in your yard. I will happily admit that this isn't a nice comfortable article about some of the interesting wildlife that grace Bayshore. Nor does it make us smile or appreciate even more the fact that we live in this amazing place. It does, however, alert us of an unwanted possible prickly predicament we would prefer to prevent. And that is something we can all be grateful for!

Dear Friends and Members of Bayshore, A very huge thank you to all of the kind emails and outpouring of love to Our Savior Lutheran Church and to its members. On Monday, August 12 the fire departments of Seal Rock, Central Coast, Yachats and Newport arrived at 6:00 am to the West side of church on fire. The fire was extinguished in the 10:00 am hour.

The fire is of suspicious nature and likely human caused. The State Fire marshal's office is the lead fire investigator. The local sheriff's office is doing the police investigation. At this moment, the church is allowing the investigators to do their work. There appear to be few leads.

The church is insured so it will be fully rebuilt in the near future once building permits and contractors can be obtained. The sanctuary side of the church building has extensive smoke damage, but was not actively involved in the fire. The Pastor's office had extreme damage. The Sunday School room had minimal damage. The administrative office and the restrooms had moderate damage.









Planning Committee Update

In recent months, the Bayshore office and Board of Directors have been receiving an increased number of accounts of perceived issues affecting our community. Some of these concerns fall outside of the Board of Director's scope of power and influence, but we still endeavor to provide a brief written acknowledgement when possible. Per Planning Committee policies, we can no longer address anonymous complaints. We need to know who is filing the complaint, a description of the issue, and an address of the animal or issue in question before the Planning Committee will investigate. Photographs are helpful to this process. As an HOA, Bayshore is limited in its ability to assess fines or curtail member privileges without evidence and due process. Historically, corrected behavior allows for a reduction or removal of assed fines. Currently, the person issuing the complaint is typically not notified of the status or results of the complaint. These rules and processes have been modified over time based on input from the Planning Committee members, combined with suggestions from the Policies and Procedures Commitee, and have been approved by the Board of Directors. Please help us enforce your concerns by following procedures and submitting the proper paperwork. Thank You



BEACH ACCESS

Please only use designated public beach accesses marked with signs to get to the beach.

• QUIET TIME

The hours of 10pm to 7 am are required quiet time per Bayshore and Lincoln County ordinance.

• RV Parking

No RVs may be parked on Bayshore properties or along the roadside without previous permission of the planning committee & within limitations set forth.


• PARKING

Please park in the garage or driveway. The roads are narrow, and vision can be obstructed by vehicles along the road. SPEED LIMIT IS 25MPH.

• PETS

Per Bayshore C&R's and Oregon law you must keep your pets confined to your yard or on a leash. Also, you must clean up after them.

• SAFETY

The ocean can be very dangerous. Please watch your children very carefully. Seals and seal pups, snowy plovers and other marine animals are protected species. Keep at least 200 feet away and keep your pets from running up on them. Federal law prohibits touching, feeding or disturbing marine mammals.

 $\mathcal{F}I\mathcal{R}\mathcal{E}$

Fire is a very real danger. Fireworks are NOT allowed in Bayshore or on the beach and are a serious hazard during dry weather. OAR 736.021.0100 prohibits "possessing, discharging or causing to be discharged any firecracker, explosion, torpedoes, rockets, fireworks or other similar devices" on Oregon beaches. Beach fires are ONLY permitted on open sand west of the dunes and cannot be started in areas of built-up driftwood.

- GARBAGE AND REFUSE DISPOSAL LOT UPKEEP

 Lots must be kept clean and in visually pleasing condition. Keep weeds, cleared and trimmed trees within the C&R limits. Garbage and other waste shall be placed in sanitary containers with lids and removed weekly. Garbage cans stored near the street must be screened from the view.
- Be kind to your neighbors.
